Dr. Julie Leininger Pycior is a Professor in the Department of History at Manhattan College. She received her doctoral degree from University of Notre Dame.

Her research interests include Mexican Americans, immigration, the 1960s, biographies and memoirs and oral history.

She has recently authored the book “*Democratic Renewal and the Mutual Aid Legacy of US Mexicans*” (Texas A&M University Press, 2014) where she expands on the topic of community organization and self-help in community solidarity. She is the editor of Bill Moyers’ book “*Moyers on America: A Journalist and His Times*.” (New Press, 2004 and paperback edition, Anchor Books, 2005) In this book, Bill Moyers explores American history, while expressing his personal views and ideas on politics, religion, and ethic. In “*LBJ and Mexican Americans: The Paradox of Power*” (University of Texas Press, 1997) Dr. Pycior delves into issues of bias and the relationship between President Lyndon B. Johnson and Mexican Americans.

She has written many articles and participated as a keynote speaker in different conferences throughout the United States.
