## “Academic Accountability, Computationalism, and Political Economy: The Future of Higher Education”

Is neoliberalism a red herring? Is it possible that an intersubjectivity dominated by computationalism—“a commitment to the view that a great deal, perhaps all, of human and social experience can be explained via computational processes”<sup>1</sup>—which caters to the neoliberal project, but is not exclusive to it, is actually that which is eroding education? Reflecting on a praxis that connects artistic interventions with pedagogy, this lecture will examine the future of higher education through the mutually-constitutive production of computing, selves, and political economy.
