

## Guanajuatense and Other Mexican Immigrantsin the United States: New Communities in Non-Metropolitan and Agricultural Regions

## **ABSTRACT**

This working paper addresses the unprecedented growth of the foreign and U.S.-born Mexican-descentpopulation in non-metropolitan and agricultural areas in the United States. It is organized into four sections. This first part of the paper is a general discussion of immigration from Guanajuato, Mexico, to these areas ofthe country. The concentration of Mexicans in non-metropolitan and agricultural areas is examined in the sec-ond section. The third part describes examples of this concentration in two communities in southeastern Penn-sylvania. In the fourth and last section, it is suggested that peasants from Guanajuato and other compatriotsnot only immigrate to these areas, many migrate in order to continue practicing subsistence agriculture in theirhomeland. Migration allows them to pursue this important traditional economic activity.
