Background

The Julian Samora Research Institute (JSRI) in conjunction with Michigan State University (MSU) Cooperative Extension conducted a survey of Hispanic Community Based Organizations (CBOs) during the summer of 1994.

The survey had several goals: 1) to identify and compile a list of community organizations offering services of interest to the Hispanic community of Michigan; 2) to assess the focus, scope, attributes, contributions and common concerns of these organizations; and 3) to collect information concerning current operating budgets and sources of funds.

Methodology

The survey was distributed to 442 CBOs that were identified by the office of the Director of Outreach at MSU Cooperative Extension, a statewide service entity. Of the 442 CBOs, 115 returned the survey forms, representing a response rate of 26 percent. Of the questionnaires returned, we noted that some were mixed "private" and "public" organizations.

For the purpose of this survey, a "CBO" is defined as "... an organization primarily devoted to 'not for profit' activities." The focus of this survey was on those oriented towards improving Michigan's Hispanic/Latino communities. The survey yielded several organizations which served diverse clienteles and had multi-dimensional programs and projects.

To the list of CBOs we also added a number of "private" organizations. By "private" we are referring to those in business "for profit." Thus, there is some heterogeneity in the range of CBOs included herein. We also point out the possibility of exclusion. The difficulty of directories such as this lies in the transiency of such organizations in terms of longevity, location, and funding. While fairly comprehensive of CBOs serving Hispanic communities in 1994, the Directory may have precluded CBOs

established after 1994. Moreover, some CBOs may have terminated their operations since the survey. In order to keep this Directory current, we at the Julian Samora Research Institute request your assistance in updating us on organizations serving the Hispanic community. Contact information is included on the cover of this document and below.

How to Use This Directory

The Resource Directory is broken down into two components: 1) an alphabetical list of Private and Public Organizations by the service category that most accurately describes the main focus of the organization, based on information provided by the CBOs themselves, and 2) an alphabetical Directory of organizations offering services of interest to the Hispanic community of Michigan, including the name of a contact person, address, phone number, and a fax number when provided. Some organizations indicated more than one service category, but we limited inclusion of a complete description of their coalitions, challenges, needs and mission to only one service category listing. We are also including the Office Directory for MSU's Cooperative Extension Offices. By calling them you may be able to obtain additional information and assistance.

Again, we are well aware of the difficulty of maintaining current information in a directory of this type. We request your assistance in this regard, asking that you provide us with updates so that we can keep this Resource Directory as current as possible. * Surplus USDA commodities (food items) are distributed bi-monthly throughout Ottawa County to assist families in need. Commodities reach over 1,000 households every other month with the help of community volunteers. Food items in the past have included: canned pork, canned vegetables, cornmeal, egg mix, flour, peanut butter, raisins, and

rice. Food items and quantities vary from month to month.

* Funds are available throughout the year to meet emergency needs related to a loss of

utility service.

* On a limited basis, funds have been available to help pay the first month's rent for homeless families in Ottawa County. Families are required to enroll in job training services and show an ability to manage household costs including rent.

* The Community Action Agency has a close relationship with a variety of human services agencies throughout the county. If an individual contacts CAA and requires additional or specific services not available in-house, referral to the appropriate agencies are made. A computerized information and referral system is used.

* Migrant farm workers and their families are assisted with food vouchers, shelter assistance, paper products and medical assistance not covered by Medicaid.

* The Weatherization Program provides free energy saving services to households all across the state. Licensed contractors inspect the home to determine what measures of energy conservation may be taken such as water heater treatment, low flow shower head, ceiling insulation, wall insulation, duct insulation, and floor insulation.

* CAA offers three Home Rehabilitation programs: the Community Home Improvement Program (CHIP), the Rehabilitation Assistance Program (RAP), and the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The Home Rehabilitation programs are designed to help with improvements necessary to meet HUD's Housing Quality Standards such as making energy improvements and creating handicap accessibility.
